

#### **PR Committee**

The PR Committee has been busy! We continue to promote our 50th year through all of our dealings with the media and on socials.

We've ramped up promotion of the Magnificent Mardi Gras event to include:

- Press releases sent to media outlets: print and radio
- Story on the event and our Woman of Distinction which resulted in frontpage coverage in the Joliet Herald News
- Appearance with Fundraising Co-Chair Cathy Miller, Bonnie Winfrey and myself on WJOL with Scott Slocum to discuss the Magnificent Mardi Gras event, as well as telling our Zonta story – educating the public about who we are and what we do
- Sharing social media posts and encouraging members to do so – it's been really nice to see how many
   Zontians are sharing the event on their own pages, AND how many CLUBS are sharing our posts. This is what it takes to spread the word! Thanks!

We plan to attend the Chair/Co-Chair meeting in February.

We've broadcast another edition of Zonta on the Move, our podcast, with ZI President Ute Scholz from Verden, Germany, which was a most enlightening discussion if you haven't listened to it yet. Ute has a wonderful vision for Zonta and her journey up through the ranks is inspiring! It was an experience trying to coordinate a time to tape the podcast, since we were unable to do so while Ute was here in the states and we had to work with USF's holiday schedule and the time difference in Germany.

We have several other podcast topics coming up, including an update on the podcast regarding the period education project in Uganda, the statistics and effects of human trafficking here in IL, and women's wellness.

We're poised to host a panel discussion covering resources for human trafficking, domestic violence and bullying, which will be on International Women's Day. We have several women lined up to speak, and are excited to bring this to the public. We're also formulating the plans for promoting the Through Her Eyes film festival. This is going to be an exciting time to be a Zonta member, and we hope you'll participate in all the upcoming events, as well as the service and advocacy events coming up.

As much as possible, we plan to be at the various service and advocacy events to take pictures and then publish as much as we can, wherever we can. Don't be surprised if one of us from PR asks you for a quote or a story as to why you're at a specific event. Many voices help us get our message out.

Once we have the nominee for our club's Woman of the Year, we will do a promotional campaign by sending out media releases, interviewing the awardee on our podcast, and getting an article in the local paper.

After the YWPA scholarships are announced, we plan to cover that meeting and have the awardees speak so that we can promote our scholarship program to the general public. We've also put up posts regarding the applications.
